The little that I know about Fli is that her pedigree name is Filiary and someone took out the three letters FLI as her nickname. Apparently she has had a lot of litters of puppies, but would not accept the last litter. Someone thought enough of her to have her spayed and put her up for adoption.

Fli catches flies! She studies the flight of a fly, and then at the right time she leaps up and usually catches the fly, adding it to her protein reserve.

Perhaps that contributed to her nickname, too. Fli likes to take long walks in the morning. She especially likes to walk along the Enfield Canal, and she often inspects her home boundary line to smell for any wild animals that may have come by.

My wife can never be replaced, but by the Grace of God Bonny has made room for a new best friend forever named Fli, and I'm sure Joan would approve.
