Birds are very curious, social creatures who can bring a lot of joy to anyone's home. If you have the time and willingness to engage with them, you too can reap the rewards of their companionship.

Dr. Sabellico adds that Budgerigars (colorful small parakeets commonly known as parakeets or budgies) originate from Australia. They are inquisitive, active little birds that love to play and show signs of affection, making them wonderful pets. Beware, however, that they also can be noisy and demand attention. They need to be housed in a safe, clean cage with toys for enrichment and perches to climb in order to stay

mentally and physically fit. They enjoy time outside their cage too so finger taming and gentle handling is a must for their happiness. But these endearing little dynamos are fragile too and require quiet time to rest in a covered cage at night. They need protection from household chemicals and safety from life-threatening interaction with larger pets. If fed a varied diet of formulated pellets, good quality seeds, clean water, fresh vegetables and fruits they can live for 10 to 12 years.
